

BASIC BOWLING SKILLS CLINIC

The MANITOBA TENPIN FEDERATION is offering basic bowling skills training clinics for novice bowlers.

The clinic is conducted by a N.C.C.P. fully certified coach and will address **bowling stance**, **approach**, **grip**, **release**, **equipment**, **one-on-one instruction**, as well as other components to improve your game.

Two types of clinics are offered:

2 hour clinic for \$10.00

6 hour clinic for \$30.00

A clinic can be organized for a group of 6 - 12 bowlers and can be held at the bowling centre that best accommodates your group.

If you have a group of interested bowlers or would like your name added to our waiting list, contact the Manitoba Tenpin Federation office at 925-5705.

They decided to roughly model the tournament format after the Professional Bowlers Association Masters – one of their major tournaments. There would be 4 qualifying games, and then the top 16 would compete in a match-play knockout-style format.

Each match would be a two-game total pinfall – the winner moves on and the loser is knocked out of the tournament. They limited this first attempt to a maximum of 32 players – and they ended up with 31 bowlers competing to become the champion.

The Tournament Manager – Domingo – had decided ahead of time that the oiling pattern would not be the normal "house shot", but instead a pattern known as USBC White #1 – which is a little less forgiving than most house patterns, but nowhere near the difficulty of a "Sport shot".

After the 4 qualifying games, the cut-line to make the top 16 was 831 (an average of just under 208). And then the match-play portion began, with qualifier #1 bowling against qualifier #16, #2 vs #15, and so on.

After 3 rounds of match play, it came down to the finals – Tereck vs Mike Schmidt – playing their match on lanes 13 & 14. Tereck, a left-hander, was fairly steady on both lanes, but Schmidt (right-hander) struggled for much of the match on lane 14, unable to successfully negotiate the notorious "hang spot" on that lane. Tereck won the two-game match, 429 to 406, securing his place in Manitoba Masters history!

MANITOBA OPENJANUARY 14-15, 2017 - CHATEAU LANES

The 36th Manitoba Open took place on Jan. 14th and 15th at Chateau Lanes with 72 entries from across Canada as well as several Midwestern states – North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota and Wisconsin.

After 10 games, the top 24 had been decided, and they would be returning the next morning to compete in the match-play portion of the tournament. It took a +54 to make the cut – a 205.4 average on the Abbey Road oiling pattern. The top qualifier was **Wade Scott** who bowled a +319 for his 10 games with a 231.9 average!

Sunday's match-play finals consisted of 8 games plus a stepladder finish for the top 5. On Sunday, Scott stayed hot, rolling a 300 game in his 5th match, winning all 8 of his matches, and averaging 237 for those 8 game! He qualified for the stepladder finals in the #1 position. The rest of the top five qualifiers were: Andy Mills (last year's champion) in 2nd, Matt McNiel in 3rd, Mitch Hupé in 4th, and Zach Wilkins in 5th.


In the first stepladder match, **Wilkins** edged out **Hupé** 194-188. **Wilkins** then beat **McNiel** 232-200. In the 3rd match, **Mills** defeated **Wilkins** by a score of 225-203.

So **Mills** moved up to play **Scott**, the #1 seed, for the title, knowing that he's have to defeat Scott twice in order to repeat as champion. In a close match, Mills had a chance to put some pressure on Scott in the 10th, but he left a pocket 4-9 split, which he couldn't convert. **Scott won the match 203 - 193.**

Manitoba Bowlers was created to share information with the rest of the bowling community who might not want all the information posted on the Winnipeg Tenpin Bowlers group. 
