The 3rd annual Heart Bowl took place on Feb 25th at Laverendrye Lanes. For those of you who don't know what this is, let me fill you in.

Donovan Alexander, a 26-year-old professional football player (currently with the Edmonton Eskimos), teamed up three years ago with the *Variety Club of Manitoba*, and Laverendrye Lanes, to initiate a bowling-themed fundraiser for the charity. To date, they have raised over \$10,000 through this event.

When asked why he chose to do this, Alexander had a simple answer – "*I owe my life to Variety*". That's a strong statement that begs further explanation. When Alexander was 18 months old, it was discovered that he had been born with two aortas and that one of them was wrapped around his windpipe. It was predicted that he would not survive for more than a few months. He needed an operation. Because his breathing was affected, he was not allowed to fly to Toronto. With financial help and support from Variety, a surgeon with the proper expertise was flown in to Winnipeg, and Alexander's problem was fixed.

When Alexander was old enough to understand what Variety had done for him, he became one of their biggest supporters, and dedicates himself to giving back to the charity. The Heart Bowl was just another way to do that.

This event has been successful every year, with every lane having 5 or 6 bowlers. Everyone is given one "warm-up game", and then a one-game competition takes place to see which team can win the (coveted) Heart Bowl trophy. And in conjunction with the bowling, there is a silent auction (which had terrific prizes by the way), which is yet another fun way to raise funds for the charity. So who was the big winner? Well, that's obvious - the Variety Club, and all of the children that they help!



Manitoba Tenpin Federation Advanced Youth Training Program

By popular demand, the Youth Development Program returned and saw the inclusion of Bantam and Prep Bowlers this year. This was a result of the grassroots clinics that have been held before and when asked if the athletes and parents would support such a program. The answer was an overwhelming yes, so we added it.

This year there are 20 athletes in this program up from 12 last year. This program is structured in a fun, learning atmosphere with an emphasis on some basics, and some drills and also some strategy.

"This is a program where you will do things you have never done on a lane before" was how the program was structured. So with some of the props being skipping ropes, baby blocks, tongue depressors, dice and foam tiles, *Mr. Clean* rubber gloves, only to mention a few, bowlers come with an eager anticipation as to what they will learn next. Did we mention the "hockey stick?"



"The purpose of this program is to give our youth bowlers an opportunity to not only develop their game, but to also enjoy the fun and excitement of coming to the lanes and being with their bowling friends. These bowlers now see bowlers from other houses on a regular, weekly basis and not just a yearly tournament or two. Many times we have to tell our athletes that the session is over, they do not want to leave. This is a very positive move in taking our youth program in the right direction." states Head Coach **Darren Naylor**. The other coaches in the program are **Brian Kokolsky** and **Richard Nose**.

"Also, this an excellent opportunity for entry level coaches to get there feet wet in coaching without the fear of making mistakes. Once they see and feel this excitement in our youth, they will become better coaches at their league level and who knows, maybe one day at the provincial level. We also must develop our youth coaches as well as our younger athletes if we are going to continue to be a province to contend with at the National level and having programs like these, will hopefully give all parties access to their development. As for parents of these athletes, it is also important that they see we value their selection of our bowling program to enroll their athlete in. It is our job to ensure that they continue to see not only the value of this selection but that we intend to give their athlete every opportunity to succeed."

Also an integral part of this program was to have the youth involved in some of decision making. This usually takes the form of the final game that is played at the end of the night. These games have taken the form of a Survivor style format to even a game of Golf on the lanes. The prize is a Tim Hortons Gift Card at the end of the night, but really they are all winners.

These athletes have seen their games get better at the league level and also at the tournament level. Parents are consulted if their athlete is enjoying the camp, and the comments we receive are very positive. "He will not miss bowling Tuesday nights" one parent states, and "loves coming to the lanes." Other comments were, "we finally found something that he enjoys doing."

It is this excitement that we look forward to holding another Development Program in the fall. This one will be of a 20 week nature. So lets leaver nothing to spare, if you have an athlete in our Youth Bowling Program and would like more information on the program, please consult your Head Coach at the your league, because when it comes to youth bowling in Manitoba......"That's how we roll!!"

The YBC Provincial Championships were held on March 3-4 / 12 in Brandon. The top qualifiers from each age division will form the 2012 YBC Manitoba Provincial Team that will compete in Woodbridge, Ontario on April 14-16/12. This year saw a change in the championship when it was held over two days instead of one day and saw the athletes compete in 10 games versus the usual 5 games in past years.

The coaches for Team Manitoba will be **Mike Boroskae** of Chateau and **Dale Wallace** of Thunderbird Bowl.

Bantam Girls Division

Brittney Rocan of Bowl Below, won the gold medal with a 10 game average of 170.4. This will be her first YBC National Tournament. As a member of the Youth Development Program, Brittney had a high score of 220. In second place, was **Jasmin Belinski** of Chateau lanes with an average of 140.1 with a high score of 171. Taking the Bronze medal was **Stephanie Korozsi** of Laverendrye Lanes (also a member of the Youth Development Program) averaged 139.1 and bowled her first game over 200 scoring a 201 in the 9th game.

Bantam Boys Division

Justin Omaga of Laverendrye Lanes, won the gold medal with an impressive 189.4 average. This will be Justin's first time attending a National event. Justin is also a member of the Youth Development Program, and had scores of 238, 215, and 210. **Sean Visarra**, also of Laverendrye Lanes took the silver medal With a 165 average & games of 225 & 222. **Zachary Weber** took the Bronze medal and averaged 159.

Junior Girls Division

Much like last year when the difference between first and third was one pin, this year was the closest division of the tournament with the difference between first and second being only 7 pins. **Melanie Wallace** of Thunderbird Lanes took the Gold medal and will return to the YBC National Tournament where she won Gold last year in Regina. Her 10 game average was 184.6 and had games of 215, 209 and 204. **Marissa Naylor** of Bowl Below, took the silver medal with an average of 183.9 and had games of 223, and 205. **Melissa Szybko-Sleva** of Chateau Lanes won the Bronze Medal with a 172.8 average & 204 High game.

Junior Boys Division

Mathew Verinder of Thunderbird Bowl will return to the YBC Nationals where he last represented Manitoba as a Bantam. His average was an outstanding 219.7 with all but one game being over 200, and included a 256, 243, 236, and 235. In second place was **Austyn Ducharme** of Laverendrye Lane with an average of 190.9 in his first YBC tournament as a Junior. Austyn had games of 245, 221, 215, and 213. Taking the Bronze medal was **Patrick Graff** also of Laverendrye Lanes with an average of 174.2. Patrick is also a member of the MTF Youth Development Program.

Senior Girls Division

Danielle Lemoine of Laverendrye Lanes will return to the YBC Nationals, with an average of 215.8. She had games of 247, 237, and 236 (3 times) to take the Gold Medal. Taking the Silver Medal was **Stephanie Adams** of Thunderbird Bowl with an average of 204.6 and 7 games over 200 including a high game of 225. Taking the Bronze Medal was **Sydney Carter Squire** also of Thunderbird Bowl with an average of 210.2 and also 7 games over 200 including a high game of 223.

Senior Boys Division

Mitch Hupe of Laverendrye Lanes took the Gold Medal with an average of an unbelievable 236.6. His games included 236, 247, 244, 257, 239, 279, 201, 203 and 213. In second place was **Ryan Kruk** also of Laverendrye Lanes with an average of 227.5 & high games of 268, 257 and 249. **Sean Coutts** of Chateau Lanes closed out the medal winners, taking Bronze with an average of 221.8 which saw games of 279 and 266.

Manitoba Youth - World Cup

Newsflash!! Recently here in Manitoba, Canada again made an appearance at the World Cup. *Mike Schmidt* was defending his title in Johannesburg, Africa and *Lynne Gauthier* just returned from her competition in Hong Kong!

We saw this as another opportunity, not only to celebrate the fact that we have two local bowlers on Canada's National Team, but also to educate our younger bowlers that our sport is played worldwide. So while the World Cup was being played in Africa, we had our own version of the World Cup here in Manitoba.

The goals of this tournament were threefold:

- 1. Have fun, and participate in a tournament during league play.
- 2. Make the bowlers more aware of what their average is and how their current score compares to it.
- 3. Educate our younger bowlers about other countries that also play the same sport

We had two Divisions – Male and Female. Every bowler was assigned a country, and given that country's flag.

There was a four-week qualifier that was based on the most "pins over average". Each week a chart was displayed to show the "cut line" and each bowler's current position - much like the real World Cup.

We decided that the top 24 would "make the cut". These bowlers would then play in a match play elimination format, using their weekly league scores, which were calculated using series plus handicap. This gave bowlers that do not have the opportunity to experience a "little pressure" on the lanes, a chance to experience it firsthand.

After several more weeks of competition, there were only two bowlers (countries) left in each Division. For the Finals, the bowlers and their countries were announced. Then they were marched onto the lanes, flanked by *Lynne Gauthier* and *Mike Schmidt*, along with the World Cup trophies (the two that Mike had won).

Also in this presentation was *Danielle Lemoine*, a Winnipegger who has represented Canada on the international stage and was a bantam bowler not that long ago. So with World Cups on display and flowers ready to be presented, the final matches took place. And the winners were: In the Female Division, USA and in the Male Division, United Arab Emirates.

Next year, we will be discussing ways to make this more of a provincial tournament.

Next on tap for our youth bowlers will be two tournaments, based on "reality TV shows" and for our novice program, it will be off to outer space, where we will be having our Spring Break Camp based on SPACE.




