In an ongoing effort to show our youth bowlers that you can have fun bowling while you are in a league, we ran an in-house tournament based on the reality TV show "SURVIVOR" As long as the bowlers scored above their average they were still in the tournament. This proved to be very educational for our bowlers as well as responsible: Here is how:

- 1. They had to know what there average was, and where to find it on their score sheet.
- 2. After each game, they had to post their score on a master score sheet. Remember the chalk board when we were in youth bowling?
- 3. They became very aware of their scores during the game to see if they were getting close to their average, thus they learned scoring.

In the first week, any bowler that bowled over the average in all three games had "immunity" the following week. For those bowlers that did not, they had another chance to return to the tournament.

The following week, they would bowl three more games. If all three games were over their average, they were back in the tournament. If only one game was over their average, they had to go to a table and pick one of three cards. The cards were a (1, 2, 3). If they picked a card that matched the game that was over their average, they were back in the tournament. If not, they were out. As the tournament winded down, the winners were starting to be decided. The prize? The winner got to throw a pie in the face of a coach, or member of Team Canada. We had 12 pies up for grabs and 9 winners. So what did we do with the other 3?



We a ticket draw. The winning ticket had to make a shot under the pressure of everyone watching and making noise. Talk about excitement! The Bantams had to hit the headpin, the preps had to make a 9 count, and the juniors had to strike.

After all was said and done, we had our 12 winners and their targets were selected. The youth entered the pie throwing arena to the tune "Bad to the Bone" by George Thorogood. Talk about funny !!!



When asked if we should do this next year, it was an overall yes. So you to can put the F _ N back into your youth program The only thing missing is ' U '.







On **November 3, 2012,** Winnipeg hosted the Brandon/Dauphin/Winnipeg Association Challenge at **Academy West Bowling Lanes**, Winnipeg's newest sanctioned tenpin bowling lanes.

Early on, Brandon had warned Winnipeg that the trophy wasn't staying in Winnipeg this year. They said they were going to take it home with them, even if they had to steal it!! And while they had had a snow storm the night before, Dauphin did make it in but they were short two bowlers, so Winnipeg loaned them a couple. And the challenge was on!!
