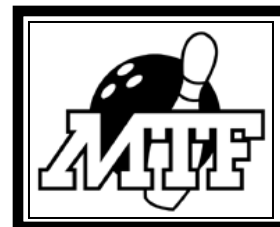

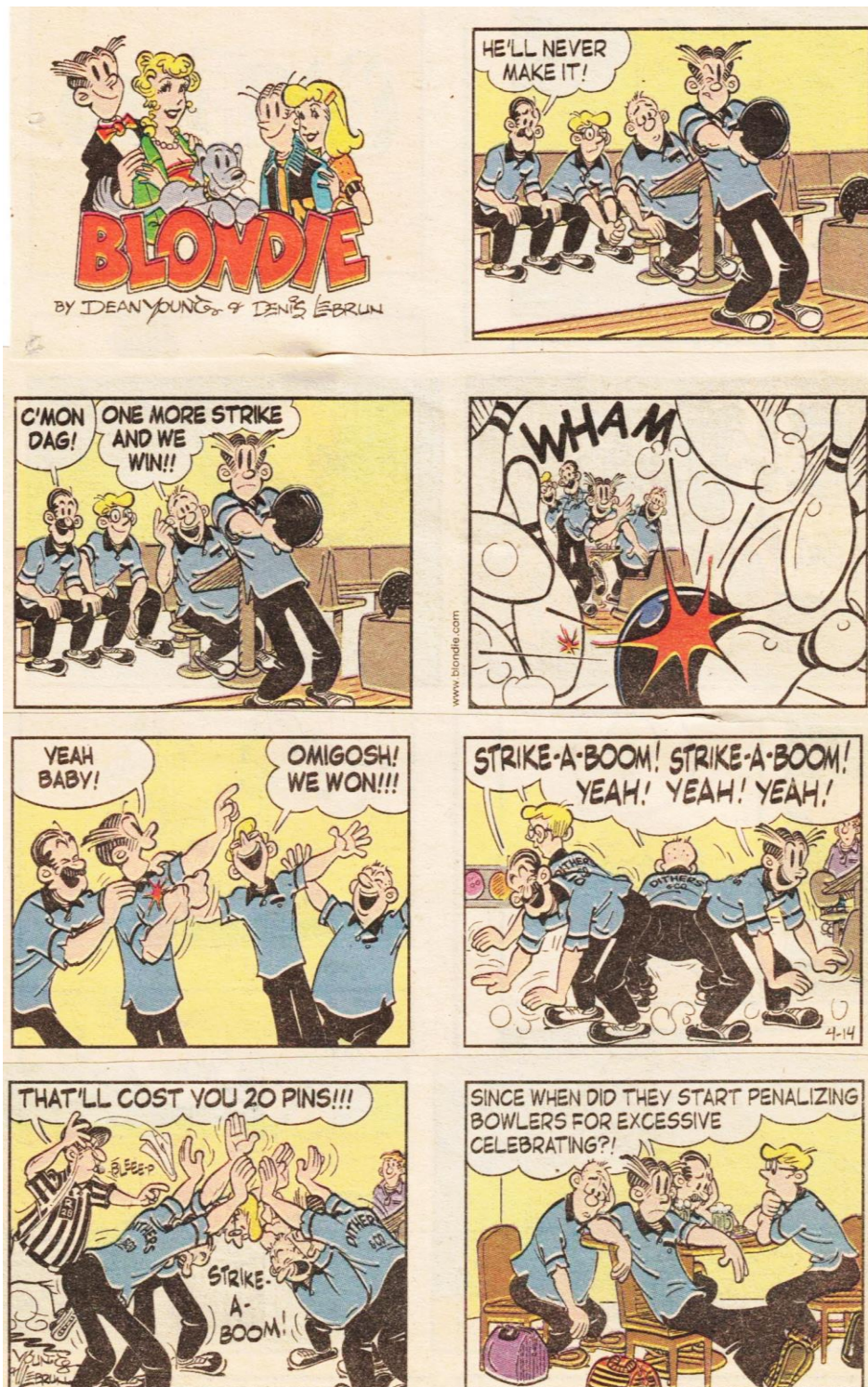

BASIC BOWLING SKILLS CLINIC

*The **MANITOBA TENPIN FEDERATION** is offering basic bowling skills training clinics for novice bowlers.*

The clinic is conducted by a N.C.C.P. fully certified coach and will address **bowling stance, approach, grip, release, equipment, one-on-one instruction**, as well as other components to improve your game.

Two types of clinics are offered:

2 hour clinic for \$10.00

6 hour (3 x 2 hr sessions) clinic for \$30.00

A clinic can be organized for a group of 6 - 12 bowlers and can be held at the bowling centre that best accommodates your group.

It turned into a good day on the lanes for Ken after he made a major adjustment early in the 2nd game with a different ball and a radical line change and he zeroed-in on the sweet spot over a couple more frames. During which he had to convert some tough spares, including a 4-7-10 split. In the 10th frame, Ken pounded out 3 solid pocket strikes to secure the 191 game.

Ken continued on from that strong *Turkey* finish with 9 more in the pocket, finishing with a 10th frame *Brooklyn* 9 count spare and capped off with another pocket strike for a 279 clean game. *Way to Go Ken !*

Having **12 strikes in a row** in a single game would have resulted in a perfect game score, but Ken was just happy that he had that 12 strike attainment reflected in his tally for the night. He said he wasn't too disappointed as it wasn't as bad as pulling a "Pekoe".

When asked to explain, Ken, (*who is also in charge of the Manitoba Bowling Hall of Fame archive and inductions*) relayed a short Manitoba bowling history story about **Peter (Pekoe) Daptil** who was one of Winnipeg's top bowlers in the late 1930s to early 1950's.

Daptil was inducted into the Bowling Hall of Fame of Manitoba in 1994 and according to his bio and achievements, he once started a 290 game with an opening frame spare and finished with 11 strikes in a row, and continued into his next game with 11 more strikes in a row, finishing with an 8 count on his 12th ball for a final score of 298. Ken said that Pekoe had told him that his only regret in bowling, was that he never scored a perfect game despite shooting 22 strikes in a row.

Still, it was a great day on the pines for Pekoe to be proud of.

2019-20 MALE YOUTH BOWLER OF THE YEAR



Austyn Ducharme

Austyn Ducharme earned the 2019-20 Male Youth Bowler of the Year Title for excelling throughout the season, capturing several high game and series awards and having outstanding performances in league and tournament competitions.

Congratulations Austyn !

When was the Winnipeg Bowling Association formed?
A- The WBA (now WTBA) was established in 1916.



When was the first 300 game bowled in Manitoba?

A – **Grant Hudson** had the first perfect game in Winnipeg in 1907.

In 1937, **Harry McMaster** became the **first bowler in Canada to win an ABC Gold Medal** for bowling a perfect game, which was bowled in Commercial League play at Saratoga Alleys on lanes 19-20.

In 1938, **Eddie Sobie** (BHFM Member – Inducted 1997) became the first person to roll a perfect game in a Canadian tournament; At Victoria Alleys on lanes 7 & 8.

Side Note: In 1936, **Bobby Hunter** rolled 233, 290 & 265 for a 788 series, during which he had 20 strikes in a row, but failed to capture that elusive 300 Game.



Major Historical Milestones of Tenpin Bowling in Manitoba

When did tenpin bowling start in Manitoba and where?

A – The first Tenpin Bowling House in Manitoba opened in **1901**; the **Woodbine Bowling & Billiard Parlor** at 466 Main Street in Winnipeg, currently the Woodbine Hotel.

When did organized (league) bowling begin in Manitoba?

A – The first bowling league was started for the **1906-07 season**; **The Senior City (scratch) League** with 4 teams at the newly opened 5 lane Saratoga Alleys. The league folded in early December 1906, but rebounded in January, 1907 with 6 teams. By the fall for the start of the 1907-08 season it was back to 4 teams. It never did exceed 12 teams as it wanted to maintain a high calibre of play with only the top bowlers in the city.

The **Commercial (scratch) League** also started in January of 1907 with 6 teams. It continued to expand, eventually adopting a handicap format to help developing bowlers, allowing it to grow into a 56 team league, which at that time, was the largest league in Canada.
