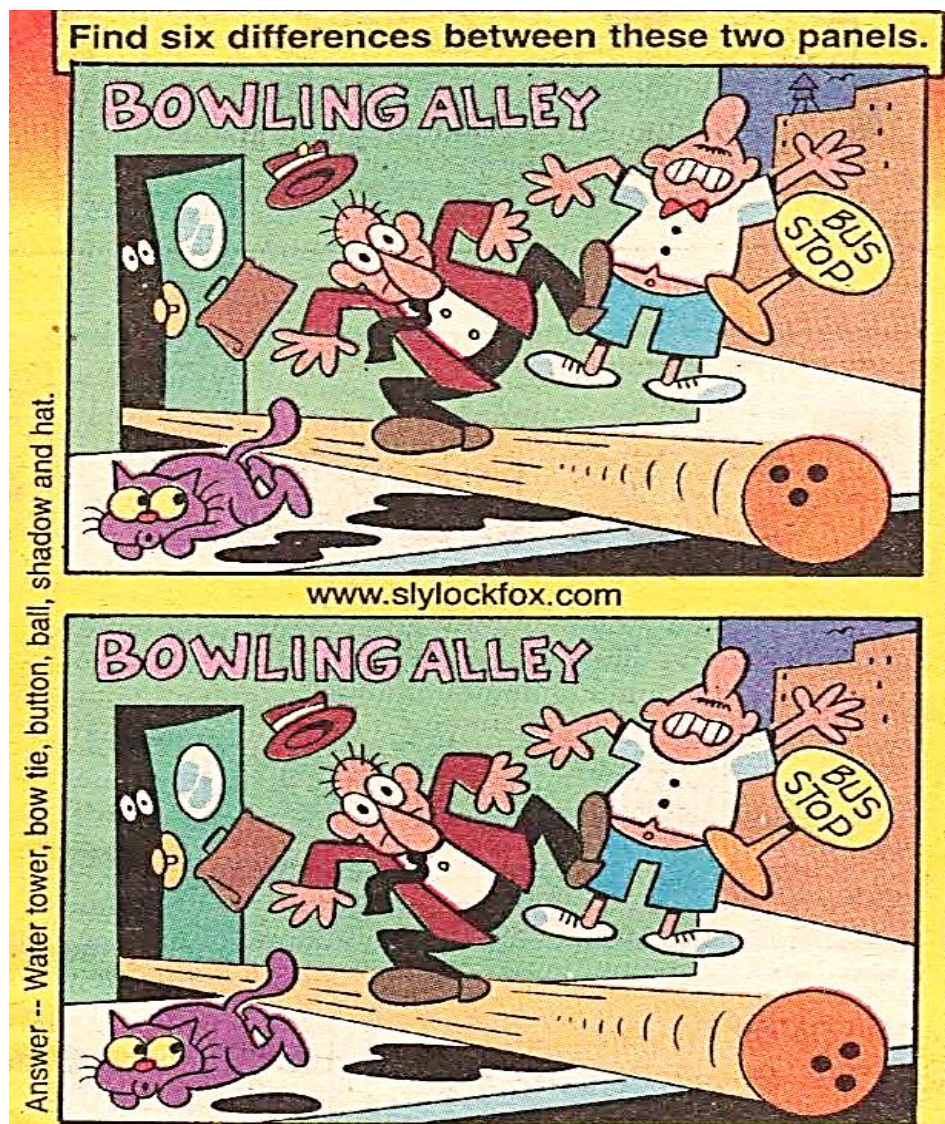

Hanrahan, Hupé Capture 2023 Roth/Holman PBA Doubles Championship

Packy Hanrahan and Mitch Hupé completed their wire-to-wire dominance at the Roth/Holman PBA Doubles Championship presented by Bally's Dover Casino Resort.

On Thursday afternoon at Mid County Lanes and Entertainment in Middletown, Del., the longtime doubles teammates maintained their lead through 12 games of round-robin match play to earn the No. 1 seed. In the title match of the stepladder finals, Hanrahan and Hupé defeated Sean Rash and Matt Ogle, 223-210.

Hanrahan collected his second title of the season and his career, while **Hupé picked up his first career PBA Tour title.**

"I felt like it was due," Hupé said. "I felt like it was going to happen."

"It was time for the boys to get one," Hanrahan added.

After a week in which strikes came early and often — Hanrahan came within one pin of the PBA's [12-game scoring record](#) — the title match turned into a grind. Competing on dual patterns - 42-foot Roth on the left lane and 38-foot Holman on the right — Rash and Ogle opened with the first five strikes. Transition had been blowing open the left lane, and Rash felt his look starting to go away.

Rash converted a 1-2-7 spare after an errant shot in the sixth frame, but Hanrahan failed to capitalize on the opportunity to take the lead. He left a 4-6-10 in his own sixth frame, ceding control of the match to Ogle and Rash. After Ogle converted a stone-9, Rash missed a 2-4-5 in the eighth frame. Rash needed a mark in the 10th frame to force Hanrahan to at least double, but missed a 10-pin.

Training with Hupé, in his ninth year with the national team, has been extremely beneficial for Ducharme. "I've gotten a lot better in the last year and a half because Mitch is home a lot more and him and I are able to go to the lanes and practise a lot more," said Ducharme, who also won the Manitoba Open title earlier this year. "He's able to work with me on things that he feels I'm lacking on. So that's kind of nice. He's kinda like an older brother to me."

The 28-year-old **Hupé** should be a medal contender. Attending his fifth world championships, he has medalled four times previously, including a gold in the 2018 masters event in Hong Kong. He also recently earned his first PBA tour victory, teaming with Patrick Hanrahan to win the top prize of US\$20,000 at the Roth/Holman Doubles Championship in Middletown, Del.

Hupé has two other top three PBA finishes, including a third-place finish at an event in Kuwait in 2019. "It's a pretty big deal," said Hupé, who also works in IT for Manitoba Liquor & Lotteries. "There's only so many people that become PBA titleists, so to be on that list is pretty cool. There's only 10 events or so a year so you only get 10 opportunities to join that club."

Hupé is thinking big in the men's team competition, where the Canadians earned a best-ever third-place finish in 2018. "I think a team gold medal is our goal as a group," said Hupé. "It's probably one of the harder ones to win because you need all five players to be at their best and it's an event we've slowly become more of a factor in. So to win that one would be on our bucket list."

Marisa Naylor is confident heading to the World Tenpin Bowling Championships in October after a 20th-place finish in women's singles in her debut at the event last year.



The 25-year-old **Ducharme** was fourth in qualifying, signalling a return to the elite level of the sport after playing volleyball and studying at Medicine Hat College Rattlers for four years. “I’m definitely at that level where I could bowl professionally,” said Ducharme. “I’m getting back into things now. I took four years off from my competitive bowling to go play competitive volleyball because I went and played college. Bowling is my No. 1 priority now.”

Ducharme’s confidence has been buoyed by an excellent performance in May at the Pan American Championship in the Dominican Republic where he combined with Graham Fach of Guelph, Ont., to earn a bronze in doubles and a silver in trios.

“There’s a lot of be learned by bowling against the best bowlers in the world,” said **Ducharme**. “It’s going to give me a better look at where I can potentially rank against those types of people. I really don’t have my expectations set overly high because I don’t really know what to expect when I get out there. I’ll take what’s given to me and see if I can help my team win some medals and go from there.”

Hanrahan delivered a match-sealing strike to claim the win. He said he has been bowling doubles tournaments with Hupé for at least eight years, dating back to their college days at Wichita State University.

“To share that moment with a guy who I’ve bowled 50, 60, 70 doubles tournaments with, just being able to share that on the biggest stage, it just kind of all pours out of you at once,” Hanrahan said. “You try not to think about winning as much as you can until it actually happens. Being able to step up in the 10th, not only for me but also for one of my best friends — you saw the explosion.”

The opening match of the stepladder finals gifted fans in attendance and watching at home on BowlTV an all-time classic. Jason Belmonte and Bill O’Neill, who earned the No. 4 seed after entering match play in 12th place, fired 11 combined strikes in the opening match; their only blemish was an O’Neill 2-pin conversion in the third frame.

However, Simonsen threw all three strikes in the 10th frame to defeat the 2018 champs, 280-279. In the semifinal, Simonsen and Barrett kept pace with Rash and Ogle, with each teams capable of shooting in the 250s entering the final frames. However, Simonsen left a 2-4-8 in the ninth frame and Barrett split in the 10th.

Rash and Ogle moved onto the championship match, their first since winning the Roth/Holman PBA Doubles Championship in 2019, with a 258-208 victory. Rash has battled a back injury all season, but rehabbed and prepared the last few weeks specifically to be ready for this tournament.

“This was the one that I focused on, to try to be as healthy as I could to get here,” Rash said. “My adrenaline took over for the last couple of games here where I didn’t feel anything, then I’m heartbroken. To help Matt try to get to a third title, to try to get another one to add to both of our résumés, literally heartbroken.”

Belmonte and O’Neill snuck into the stepladder finals following a chaotic conclusion to the position round. Three teams, separated by just 18 pins, vied for the final spot on the show: Jakob Butturff and Matt Zweig, Sean Lavery-Spahr and Santtu Tahvanainen, and Belmonte and O’Neill, who sat in sixth place entering the position round.

After a strong start, Lavery-Spahr and Tahvanainen fell behind in the match with Belmonte and O’Neill, turning the battle into a two-horse race. Though the teams were not bowling head-to-head, they matched each other strike for strike — and then split for split.

Zweig left and did not convert a 3-4-6-7-10 split in their ninth frame, opening the door for Belmonte to secure the fourth seed. Moments later, Belmonte left a 2-8-10 split in their 10th frame to finish with 241. But the 2018 Roth/Holman Doubles champions beat Lavery-Spahr and Tahvanainen to win their match and the 30 bonus pins.

Naylor will head to worlds, slated for Oct. 1-14, brimming with confidence. “I know what to expect, especially being at worlds and I went to worlds as a youth (bowler) in 2018,” she said. “So having that experience will be beneficial for dealing with nerves but also knowing what to expect and performing. From a women’s standpoint, we definitely want to medal but we also want to have a good performance for qualification for other tournaments coming up.” Naylor will be joined on the Canadian women’s squad by Karine Bouchard of Milles-Iles, Que., Jade Cote, Farnham, Que., Brittney Turcotte of Chateauguay Quebec Jennifer Besana of Richmond Hill, Ont., and Calgary’s Samantha How.

Hupé and Ducharme will lead a group of Canadian men that also includes Francois Lavoie of Quebec City, Darren Alexander of Essex, Ont., Jordan Jung from Coquitlam BC and Nathan Ruest-Lajoie of Temiscouata-Sur-Le-Lac, Que. **Hupé**, who also competes on the Professional Bowlers Tour, was the top male competitor at the Canadian Tenpin Federation’s team trials in January.

Winnipeg Trio Taking on Bowling World

MARISA Naylor will be making her second trip to the World Tenpin Bowling Championships this fall and she'll have the company of two other Winnipeggers — **Mitch Hupé** and **Austyn Ducharme** — when she leaves for Kuwait. The trio will form perhaps the largest Manitoba contingent at the worlds ever.



Naylor, 25, debuted with a 20th-place finish in the women's singles at the 2022 championships in Peru. She was the second best Canadian woman at the event. "Going to Peru last year really reassured me that I was on the right stage and I belong there," said Naylor, a communications manager for St. John's College on the University of Manitoba campus. "I think this year I'll be able to take that experience and even lead the team a little bit with having three rookies on the team."

In the other match, Butturff doubled in the 10th frame to shoot 239. However, Ogle won the match with a strike in his 10th frame, costing the Arizona natives the 30 bonus pins they needed to stay ahead of Belmonte and O'Neill.

Meanwhile, Hanrahan and Hupé had long locked up the top seed. The two dominated in qualifying, posting the best and ninth-best individual scores for the 12 games. They maintained their lead of more than 200 pins through an additional 12 games of match play, then polished off the championship match with a title-clinching strike.

"I didn't want anyone else throwing that shot in the whole field," Hupé said. "I knew he was going to do it." "Could you write a better ending than that?"

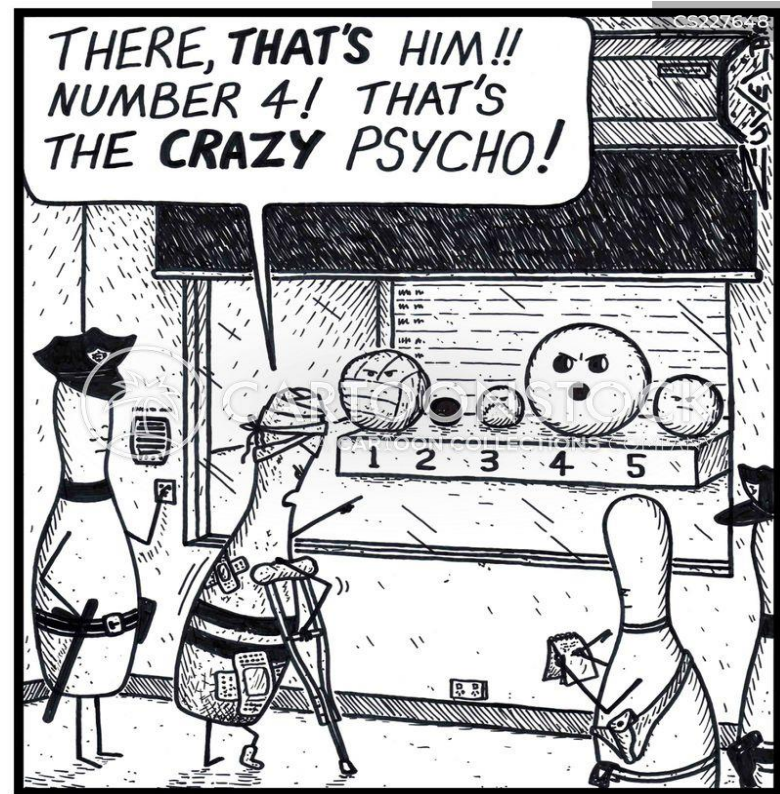

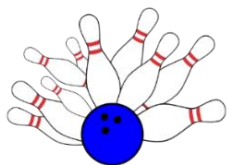

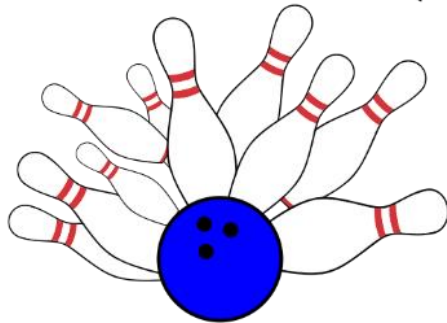
